

# Our Club's Trip Rules (Organiser's rules apply for overseas trips)

- A. Bookings allowed on all trips. Two trips & club membership is a must.
- B. A deposit or full payment to be made at time of booking.
- C. Full payment <u>MUST</u> be paid at least two weeks before departure date.
- D. Trip Organiser to handle trip & bookings, & Treasurer to handle finances. Cancellations due to weather will be refunded in full, or transferred to another trip.
- E. Members cancelling for any reason will lose full monies unless they find a replacement for their position on the trip.
- F The trips Organiser will determine if there are enough people to run a trip & if not will notify cancellation two weeks prior to departure. Non financial members will be charged an extra \$10 on trips.

**MPI Fisheries - Northland** 

From 1 April 2024, new rules for measuring packhorse rock lobster mean fishers must measure the tail width.

The minimum legal size is a tail width \ of 84mm for male and 90mm for female packhorse rock lobsters.

The new tail width measurement for **packhorse rock lobster** is the same as the way **spiny red rock lobster** are measured, although it has a different minimum legal size.

Measuring the tail width is less stressful for the rock lobster, and easier for fishers.

Fishery Officers will be enforcing this new rule by checking fishers have measured the tail width and not the tail length. Failure to measure these rock lobster correctly could result in a fine.

#### 13-Year-Old Scuba Diver Sets New Record, Performs 38 Magic Tricks Underwater

Avery Emerson Fisher made the record by performing 38 magic tricks underwater in three minutes.

A 13-year-old girl from the United States has been making headlines for her extraordinary abilities. People were surprised by her capability to perform outstanding magic tricks while she remained submerged in water. She set the record for most magic tricks underwater in three minutes. In a video shared by the official Instagram handle of Guinness World Records, she was dressed in scuba diving gear and performed various fascinating tricks. The caption read, "Congratulations to 13-year-old scuba diver Avery Emerson Fisher (USA) who's conjured up some underwater magic."

Further, Guinness World Record mentioned, "Avery felt so at home in the tank when she was there – despite the cold—that she named the fish swimming around her during her practice sessions, including one she named Zeeto who seemed keen to join in as much as possible." Avery performed 38 tricks within the time limit. She surpassed the previous record of 20, established by professional magician Martin Rees in the UK in 2020.

Guinness World Records stated that Avery had always enjoyed going to her local aquarium and decided she wanted to learn to scuba dive during the 2020 lockdown when she was only 10 years old. Reportedly, Avery started studying and passed all of her online exams. She began training and obtained her open water diver certificate during the summer, and she has since acquired a total of 12 certificates and completed over 30 ocean dives. Avery took her passion for scuba diving to a new level by setting this record. She went to the Aquarium of the Bay in San Francisco, California, on November 11 to set the new record. As per the official report, her effort occurred within the tunnel aquarium, where temperatures dropped to 58 degrees Fahrenheit (14 degrees Celsius) as several fishes swarmed about her. The judges associated with the Guinness World Records and a pair of expert witnesses then analysed her footage and determined she had successfully completed 38 illusions out of the 50 she had planned.

GWR mentioned that Avery prepared for her record attempt for months and even acquired a Scuba Magician qualification from Chef Anton, the inventor of Scuba Magician, a PADI Distinctive Speciality.

Her family and friends watched Avery perform as many magic tricks as she could in three minutes. Reportedly, the young girl is extremely passionate about marine conservation and environmental sustainability, and she intends to raise awareness while inspiring others to try scuba diving.
